

Baghdad International Airport (IATA: BGW, ICAO: ORBI), is Iraq's largest international airport, located in a suburb about 16 km (9.9 mi) west of downtown Baghdad in the Baghdad Governorate. It is the home base for Iraq's national airline, Iraqi Airways flying both national and international flights and has many airlines such as (G9, TK, RJ, 6Q, EK, IF, PC, IZG, FZ, ME, NP, QR)

ABU Nawas street Running parallel to Sadn, Abu Nuws Street on the riverbank is the city's showpiece and entertainment hub, named for a poet noted for his audacious verse—. The statue of Scheherazade is also on the street. A well-known figure from the novel 1001 Nights

Kahramana is a fountain located in Baghdad's Sa'adoon Street depicting a scene from the legend of Ali Baba and the Forty Thieves; a story taken from One Thousand and One Nights

Almutanabi St near the old quarter of Baghdad; at Al Rasheed Street ,It is the historic center of Baghdad bookselling, a street filled with bookstores and outdoor book stalls. It was named after the 10th-century classical lraqi poet al-Qishla clock tower and its public square located at the eastern bank of Tigris River that bisects Baghdad.

Dijlah Village Located in the heart of Baghdad, the Dijlah Village Complex is an innovative mixed-use commercial center whose 12,000 m2 riverside facility constitutes an indispensable focal point for this vibrant neighborhood community. This stunning. state-of-the-art complex, with its wide range of aesthetic, culinary and active enjoyments, hosts several additional Quark Studio design projects—a trio of fine-dining establishments Seafood Baghdad. Traditional Turkish Restaurant and Steak House as well as Shisha Lounge.

International Train Station A bustling transportation hub facilitating seamless travel and trade between nations, connecting people from different cultures and backgrounds.

Iraqi National Museum A treasure trove of Iraqi history and culture, preserving and exhibiting invaluable artifacts that offer insights into the rich heritage of the region.

Tahrir Monument A significant landmark commemorating a momentous event in the country's history, symbolizing the spirit of liberation and freedom.

Armenian Church A sacred place of worship for the Armenian community, showcasing their religious and cultural traditions through stunning architecture and spiritual practices.

Sheikh Abdul Qadir AlKilani Mosque A majestic mosque dedicated to Sheikh Abdul Qadir AlKilani, a revered Islamic scholar and Sufi saint, serving as a spiritual sanctuary for worshippers.

Al Khulafaa Mosque: A mosque named after the caliphs (Khulafaa), providing a serene environment for Muslims to engage in prayer and reflection.

AlRasafi Monument A remarkable monument paying homage to a prominent figure or historical event, contributing to the cultural tapestry of the area.

Mustanseriya Historical School An esteemed educational institution with a storied past, renowned for its pursuit of knowledge and contributions to various fields of study.

Bagdadi Museum An enriching museum experience showcasing the vibrant history, art, and cultural heritage of Baghdad, inviting visitors to delve into its fascinating past.

Copper Bazaar: A vibrant marketplace teeming with shops and stalls offering a dazzling array of copper items, where **Imam Kadhim Shrine** A sacred shrine dedicated to Imam Musa al-Kadhim, a revered figure in Shia Islam, attracting pilgrims and devotees seeking spiritual solace.

Abu Hanifa Shrine A revered shrine commemorating Abu Hanifa, a renowned Islamic jurist and theologian, where visitors can pay their respects and seek inspiration.

Borsippa An ancient city with historical ruins, offering a glimpse into the past with its archaeological sites, temples, and structures that showcase the city's rich cultural heritage.
